She had never lived in the United States before moving to our town to teach at the high school. She was unfamiliar with our culture. She knew no one. But when someone told her about our church, she was immediately interested in the choir because of her love for singing. Choir members befriended her. They invited her home for Sunday lunches and traditional holiday meals. She listened to the worship leader's devotionals at rehearsals and to the preacher's

sermons. She was singing Christian songs and hymns every week. Although in her home country Christianity was suppressed, she soon became convinced that Jesus was the only way to know God. She saw His impact on her choir friends. Several shared the gospel with her, and within a few months, her life was changed forever!

Whether you greet people, work in the nursery, teach a class, or sing in the choir, God has placed you in a vital ministry that has the supernatural potential to help others come to know and trust Jesus for salvation. How can you be a part of what God is doing through the ministries of your church?

Pray. Slow down and begin this journey by renewing your fellowship with the Lord. James encouraged us to "draw near to God, and He will draw near to you" (James 4:8). As we spend time with Him, His presence begins to affect our hearts, and our

hearts begin to align with His. Moved with compassion for the lost, Jesus taught His followers to ask the Father "to send out workers into his harvest" (Matthew 9:38). The Father "sends" those whose hearts have been touched with the same compassion Jesus has for the lost. Pray also with others involved in your ministry area, asking the Lord to give you opportunities to share the gospel.

Trust. Evangelism can be scary. We fear not knowing what to say – or worse – saying the wrong thing. Jesus never intended that we serve Him in our own strength. In fact, He said, "you can do nothing without Me" (John 15:5). He is not counting on you to produce results. He is calling you to rest in Him (Matthew 11:28-29; John 15:4-5). Trust Him.

Care. Luke made a powerful observation about Jesus when he wrote that "all the tax collectors and sinners were approaching to listen to him" (Luke 15:1). Why did so many secular and irreligious people feel so drawn to Jesus? They felt loved and cared for when they were around Him. They wanted to hear anything and everything He had to say! Similarly, as we genuinely care for the hard-to-love personalities God brings near to us, He will give us remarkable opportunities to share the gospel.

What happened to the young woman who was saved through the choir ministry? When the school year ended, she returned to her home country. As a fearless and vibrant witness for Christ, she was able to lead her parents and others in her family to the Lord. Notice that she didn't connect with all the ministries of our church... just one. But it was enough, because it was a gospel sharing ministry! ~ DP

Strengthening the Shepherds: A Group for Pastors and Church Staff

There is something special about being a shepherd. When stationed in Scotland years ago, I had the opportunity to get to know a few of the local shepherds, men who had committed themselves to a demanding lifestyle. It was not easy. It was lonely, the responsibilities were great, the sheep were not always cooperative and sometimes they were downright belligerent. Topping it off, the job of the shepherd was very demanding, requiring the shepherd to brave snowy nights and pelting rainfall to attend to a sheep in need, many times helping to bring a new sheep into this world. The job was physically and mentally stressful, with few tangible rewards. The pay was not that good and the returns were sometimes meager. Yet, in spite of all this, I never once heard a shepherd say he wanted to change jobs. In spite of the low pay, bad hours, and unappreciative sheep, most of them found a sense of purpose in their job because, you see, it wasn't about them, it was about the welfare of the sheep.

In Matthew 9: 36-38, we are told that Jesus, being with His disciples saw the people around him and "had compassion on them because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd." He then told his disciples that the harvest was great and that they were to pray that the Lord of the harvest would send out more shepherds into the fields. Sounds to me like Jesus saw value in, and had a heart for shepherds.

As ministers, we are all called to be "shepherds" to the people whom God places in our field of service. Yet, just like the Scottish shepherds I knew, the job can be almost overwhelming. It can drain us emotionally, spiritually, and physically. It can destroy both our relationship with our families as well as our Christian walk, and bring us to the point where we "just want to walk away." The job of being a shepherd can cause us to doubt both our calling to ministry and whether God really cares at all about His servants.

Consequently, it becomes critically important for pastors and ministers to learn from the experiences of each other and to develop survival skills for ministry. With this in mind, NBA is sponsoring a *Strengthening the Shepherds* group to assist pastors and staff in developing the skills to be more effective in the myriad roles and responsibilities they carry. The meeting schedule and venue has yet to be determined, but all pastors and staff are encouraged to attend. As we meet, encourage, learn from each other, share God's Word and learn new skills we can regain the passion for ministry and rekindle that "fire in the soul" that brought us to ministry in the first place. 

The annual church profile is a snapshot of church statistics. It provides a knowledgeable look at the growth and potential of each church. Reporting the statistics has several benefits for the church, the association, and the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

- 1. The church can track growth over time.
- 2. The data can be used to help church leaders plan ministry and outreach strategies.
- 3. The church can share the data when meeting with prospective pastors and church staff.
- 4. The data can be used to help secure loans for building projects.
- 5. The data can be used to assist church planting in reaching people groups.
- 6. The number of messengers your church sends to the LBC Annual meeting is determined by data provided on the ACP.
- 7. The local association and the Louisiana Baptist Convention can use the information to plan strategies and support existing programs as well as to identify areas for church planting.
- 8. The Louisiana Baptist Convention archives the data for the church in case theft, fire or natural disasters destroy church records.
