The annual church profile is a snapshot of church statistics. It provides a knowledgeable look at the growth and potential of each church. Reporting the statistics has several benefits for the church, the association, and the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

- 1. The church can track growth over time.
- 2. The data can be used to help church leaders plan ministry and outreach strategies.
- 3. The church can share the data when meeting with prospective pastors and church staff.
- 4. The data can be used to help secure loans for building projects.
- 5. The data can be used to assist church planting in reaching people groups.
- 6. The number of messengers your church sends to the LBC Annual meeting is determined by data provided on the ACP.
- 7. The local association and the Louisiana Baptist Convention can use the information to plan strategies and support existing programs as well as to identify areas for church planting.
- 8. The Louisiana Baptist Convention archives the data for the church in case theft, fire or natural disasters destroy church records.

"...besides the other things, what comes upon me daily: my deep concern for all the churches." ~ 2 Corinthians 11:28

"Why do we even need an association?" The young pastor meant no offense. He was just being honest. Some of the older pastors shifted uncomfortably in their seats, obviously wishing the younger man hadn't spoken up. As a guest speaker to their association's executive board meeting, I had been asked to talk about new ways Baptists are "associating" as groups of churches.

He was asking the right question! Why should Baptist churches associate with one another?

Associations have been facing the uphill task of adapting to the rapid social and economic changes that have been affecting churches in North America for the last 20 years. The result is that there are multiple approaches to being an association that didn't exist before.

When most churches shared the same meeting times, music, and ministry design (e.g., Sunday School, Discipleship Training, Brotherhood, WMU etc.), associations worked at providing programmatic support for those shared organizational practices. By being involved with the association, a church could easily acquire support for their weekly ministries. I call this the Program Support **Model** of associationalism – and it is still the most popular – it's the way we've been doing associations since the 1960s.

Recognizing that the one-size-fits-all no longer works when all the churches are using different ministry designs, some associations keep adding support strategies for every new program being used in their churches. This enables the association office to cast itself as a "one stop" resource for their churches. I call this the Resource Center Model of associationalism. However, in an age when a simple internet search can yield a wealth of information and practical guidance, churches aren't looking to the association as a primary source of programmatic support. Some do... most don't.

In a sharp move away from the older approaches, some associations have embraced the Coaching-Consultation Model, which looks to the associational staff as church consultants, who serve as primary resources for expert counsel, advice, and troubleshooters for every church problem. In the **Regional Priorities Model**, the association facilitates the accomplishment of a set of shared missional priorities by mobilizing churches to work together. In the Networking Model, the association works to connect existing resources in the churches with member churches needing those resources.

Truthfully, there is merit to each of these approaches. But when that young pastor asked, "Why do we even need an association?," he was not asking which model for associationalism is the best. He was asking for a compelling rationale for the very existence of the association.

Every pastor and serious ministry leader already has one or more networks of friends and ministry colleagues who exchange information and experience. It might be an informal group of friends or a well-organized, affinity-based network of ministries. The reason why you hold those networks in high regard is due to the fact that they contribute in some way to your life and ministry, adding value in some way. You find yourself looking forward to engaging with those networks as frequently as possible, as it typically results in experiences that are both meaningful and beneficial.

Why can't our association be a network like that? I believe it can... and it should!


