A year ago, on February 8th, a small group of students stayed back after a 10 a.m. chapel service at Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky, to worship and pray. As students made their way to the altar rail across the front of the stage, the Holy Spirit ignited a deeper, heart-level work. Word spread swiftly as students began to message one another "you need to get back to Hughes!"

They stayed. The movement grew. To accommodate the crowds, two additional campus chapels and a local church building were opened. The number of daily attendees quickly surpassed three thousand, including students, faculty, and guests. Slipping into main auditorium on a Saturday evening, I was one of those "guests." I became a part of the Asbury awakening for 48 hours.

For most of my adult life I have been a student of revival, but I am no expert. In smaller groups, I have "tasted" a little of what happens to His people in His Presence, but never on the scale that I experienced at Asbury. While I was driving home, a friend sent a message asking, "what were the marks of this revival?" Without hesitation I replied, "His Presence. Worship. Prayer. Testimony. Scripture reading. Brief pointed preaching. Life change and deliverance."

I sat on the floor. I sat in the balcony. I made multiple trips down front to pray. I spent time in the overflow areas and outside as crowds gathered to hear the service over loudspeakers. With my Bible opened, I listened carefully to the messages, testimonies, and scriptures that were shared. I heard what He was saying to me. I made notes in my journal. I prayed with people I didn't know, and they prayed for me. Then we would sing praises to Him – and sing, and sing, and sing.

It quickly became obvious that once there, no one wanted to leave. Why?

Our Father was there and He was making Himself known, and that is the simplest explanation for what happened at Asbury. There is a great difference between knowing that "God is here" with my head and knowing His presence with my heart. That difference is what we mean when we say "revival."

Why do we need revival? Because we need Him!

Revival is essential. Revival is the restoration of God's presence to His people. In Exodus 33, God threatened to remove His presence from His people. Understanding that there is no real life apart from God's presence, Moses pleaded for God to return to His people. In verse 15, Moses said, "If Your Presence does not go with us, do not bring us up from here." God's presence is essential. We need Him, and we were never intended to do life or church without Him.

Revival is also experiential. In other words, when God is present, life is different. In Acts 3:19, Peter said, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." Peter understood that the presence of God alone could refresh and renew the hearts of His people.

Why do we need God's Presence? Books have been written answering that question, but let me share five reasons that come to mind...

1. We need Him if we are ever going to recover a biblical sense of fear and awe. In Revelation 1:17, John fell on his face in the presence of God. He simply could not stand. More than a physical response, the bowing of our bodies reflects the yielding of our hearts to His rule in our lives. When God is present, our lives are reoriented around Him and not ourselves.

- 2. We need Him if we are going to do real battle with sin in our lives. In Isaiah 6:1-5, the prophet had a life-defining encounter with the holy presence of God. The result was that he became intensely aware of his own sinfulness. Like raising the lights in a darkened room, God's holiness will highlight all the impurities in our lives. Isaiah wanted to deal with the sin in his life and so will we!
- 3. We need Him if we are going to love the world the way He does. In Luke 9:36-38, Jesus has compassion on the masses of people without God. He feels something that is visceral, engaging all the emotions in a desire to release others from spiritual darkness and disorientation. When He is present among us, our hearts will come into alignment with His heart.
- 4. We need Him if we are going to answer the heart cry of our generation. All around us, people have questions about God. Who is He? What is He like? Can He forgive me? Can He help me? They are interested in talking to someone who really knows God, but studies indicate that they are not looking to churches for those answers. They are not moving away from an interest in God, as much as they are running away from the institutional church. They have questions about God and a real hunger for spiritual reality, and they want those answers from people they know and trust.
- 5. We need Him if we are going to see more people giving their lives to Christ, trusting Him for salvation. In the presence of God, lives are changed and resistance to the gospel melts away. However, today we are seeing the fewest number of people coming to Christ since the 1940s.

Everything changes when God comes among us! Let us pray that He will revive each of our hearts with Himself, transforming our nation as we are transformed as His people.




